



Woden Valley FC Presidents Report 2008

The 2008 season saw WVFC grow to 270 players competing in 16 teams with significant success throughout the club.

2008 was another year of growth and change for WVFC with new faces on the clubs committee and in the coaching ranks. Joining us at the committee table were Rosa Ruiz(Registrar), Kar Chaivanacoopt, (PL/Womens Coordinator) and Kieran Angel (SL/Womens Coordinator). The club is run by a total committee of 10.

Joining us in the PL mens coaching ranks saw Paul Gagetti take the lead role with the 1st grade side ably assisted by John Helgeson. A big ask for somebody new to coaching but Paul's extensive playing experience proved valuable and significant improvement has been achieved with the team missing the finals by 1 spot finishing in 5th position. The task of PL Pathways coach was accepted by Andy Diggle. I think Andy would describe the journey as an 'interesting' one but the job of balancing the pressures of promoting youth whilst providing a competitive reserves team has been achieved, with the team again narrowly missing out on a finals spot finishing 5th.

We also saw new faces in Christine Taylor and Erin Freuin combining for the womens Premier League with Vince Taglieri working hard at promoting a youth pathway into womens SL1. A suggested womens PL framework change that sees it closer to the mens PL setup may provide further challenges next season. Overall there perhaps needs to be more of a focus on the womens side of the club especially when it comes to retaining those girls in the game as they finish their junior days.

The club took a leap of faith in 2008 by entering the SL1 and SL2 men's competitions (the only mens Premier League club to do so). The work of Nick Issacson, Neal Harris and Mike Swan was admirable in seeing the SL1 side through a testing season, whilst Jacky Gibson's team newly promoted SL2 side impressed, losing the SL2 minor premiership in questionable circumstances on the last day of the regular season.

Another new team, men's SL4 was led by Joe Italiano through a competitive season in SL4 whilst the Woden Valley family was joined in SL5 by Rohan Smith's Northside based team who trained at O'Connor but played at Hughes.

2008 saw WVFC finally achieve its very own web site www.wvfc.asn.au. This move allowed a greater presence for all our valued sponsors with a much improved profile for our major backers as well as providing all the latest club news and information. I enourage everyone to bookmark the site for next season. The club also made an investment in buying a storage container for Mawson at last, as well as a fully enclosed trailer used primarily for the PL canteen operations. Both purchases should serve the club well for years to come.

The club continues to grow in size and complexity and with that comes challenges. We continue to learn our trade in both the men's and women's Premier Leagues as well as facing the financial realities of being competitive at these top levels. Although proud of our reputation in promoting youth at every opportunity, 2008 saw the club reward both Premier League coaches and players to a modest degree. If we value the overall impact, having Premier League programs has on the whole club (junior and senior) we will need to remain realistic as to how far youth development can take us, working hard to see the club enabled financially to compete for players and coaches. The future organization of the club will need to be continually reviewed to ensure opportunities can be taken when they present themselves whilst also ensuring Premier league operations do not jeopardise the financial security of the general club.

Every player at Woden Valley was subsidised in 2008 in an attempt to spread the benefits of sponsorship to all members. Individual team sponsorships aided some teams further, which the club is happy to support. The role of sponsorship is crucial to a senior club in allowing it to set reasonable registration fees and we encourage any interested parties to contact club officials ready for 2009.

New initiatives in 2008 included the very first WVFC year book, thanks to Maria Gagetti for making this happen this season. Also launched this year was our first membership scheme. The 'Premier Membership' gives further much needed financial support to the club whilst providing an increasing range of benefits to these who join. The current membership is valid until the end of 2009. Full details are available on www.wvfc.asn.au.

Although all teams found space to train, the poor condition of surfaces at Mawson will see some teams look for alternatives next year. The arrival of new lights may help spread the load at Mawson in 2009. Indeed it is pleasing to see the theme of improved facilities being picked up in the new Capital Football strategic plan. The sport continues to win the battle of participation rates but there is a need for all weather training and playing surfaces to be built. The now unused driving range area adjacent to the Mawson fields is on the radar for such a development as the Southside equivalent of the soon to be built artificial surface at Hawker Enclosed.

Major events in the year included the opening of the new Mawson club house The club house opening day itself saw Central Coast Mariners players and coach attend, a relationship that we I hope we continue to encourage as we had players on the fringe of picking up youth A League contracts with the Mariners this season. The gala night on Aug 22nd saw the club celebrate WVSC's 20th birthday. A great night with a plenty of laughter and fun at the Hellenic Club, thanks to Lynn Eager and all involved for a tremendous event.

Special mention to one team: Entered as a WVSC team because of its entry in a junior competition, Michael Asize and his Premier League U16's have swept all before them in 2008, as Kanga Cup Winners and League Champions. The strength in this age group bodes well for senior Premier League sides in 2009.

Finally we say goodbye to Tony Radford as a team coach this year. Tony's influence on the players and teams he has coached over the past two years has been significant.

To all the many people who have made and continue to make WVFC such an enjoyable to club to be involved with, THANK YOU. Hope to see you all back in 2009.


The presentation of a large gnome going by the name of 'Gordo' to the winning team + miniture cups saw proceeding close on a project that had its inception way back in 2002.



WFVC wins Lifeline Challenge Cup

Mens Premier League with Lifeline Cup.

On the 29th April WVFC threw its support behind Lifeline Canberra and its many important services to the community. As part of this relationship the Clubs Premier League sides took part in a brand new competition named after Lifeline.

The Lifeline Canberra Cup was played between WVFC and Canberra City across both home and away legs of their mens Premier League fixtures throughout the season. The first leg kicked off on 4th May at Hawker and concluded at Woden enclosed on 6th July, where the cup was presented to the overall winner of the 3 Premier Legue grades.

The 2nd round of games between WVFC and Canberra City concluded with the Woden 1st grade team needing to win to secure the inaugural Canberra Lifeline Cup. A 2-1 victory did the business and David High from Canberra Lifeline was on hand to accept the \$200 raised on the day by a raffle (won by Mick Alexander) and also to present Marcin Zygmunt with the trophy. This is the second of the year for the club after securing the Southside Challenge Cup in the pre season.









WODEN VALLEY PATHWAYS - MENS

The Premier League Pathways team had a season of progression with last seasons points tally of 19 being increased to 27 pts in 2008. Despite this, the team narrowly missed out on a finals spot finishing in 5th place. Belconnen Utd eventually taking the Grand Final.

Delays in the naming of the squad made for interesting pre-season but one that in fact promised much for the year. The first outing of the season against ANU also bode well with a convincing 3-nil victory to the lads. But the cyclical nature the PPL season now saw the 'bear' period with large defeats to ACTAS and Canberra FC split by a close loss to Canberra City. The City result was a respectable result considering that we played most of the second half with 10 men, including Jirrima as stand-in goalkeeper, dominated play in the second and were unlucky not to take away something.

The problem with this run of form was that the next fixture saw us play unbeaten Belconnen at McKellar. No worries though with a fantastic game. Haydn O'Kelly began the scoring, and in the second half was followed by a terrific strike by Ben Rundle making us think a 2-1 result was on the cards but an equaliser from Belconnen meant just one point from a confidence boosting game.

A significant turning point with bear turning to bull for PPL. Next up were Queanbeyan who were seen off after an excellent strike by Ben Rundle and then onto 4th placed O'Connor. But the team continued the good form of previous weeks and secured the points with a 4-2 win, excellent goals to Luke Pilkington (2), Alex Barnes and Nick Tsakiris. Woden now taking 4th place. The roll was well and truly on with confidence high unfortunately for Olympic as the local derby was settled with a very tidy 2-0 victory with goals to Under 18 striker Lukas Cole playing off the bench, and a blinder of a strike from the edge of the 18 yard box to Hayden O'Kelly. Stand-in goalkeeper from the State 4s, Danny Williams, made an excellent contribution.

Tuggeranong were next to visit Woden Enclosed and two pre-season losses were to be avenged as Woden earned a very hard fought 1-0 victory after a magnificent header from mid-fielder, Simon Hinde. Will Laurie in goals pulled off some stunning saves. Good contributions and depth on the bench from P18 players, Gary Alexander, Daniel Moutrey, Chris Ruiz and Luke Davoren. Woden now moving into 3rd place. One hangover from the early ACTAS and Canberra FC games was a negative goal difference.

That was erased with an 8-0 demolition of ANU, a hat trick to Tom McLachlan, and a brace of goals each to Phil Swan and Lukas Cole and a penalty to Alex Barnes. The five top teams won on the day, no change to position and then there was ACTAS. A confidence going into this game was soon seen to be misplaced and the slide began with this 8-nil defeat which saw ACTAS dominate the first half when 6 goals were put away. Woden did play better in the second half but the damage had been done. A 2-nil loss to Canberra City was followed by a visit to Canberra FC, despite going in level courtesy of a Zac Smedley special, the 2nd half saw the Deakin club dominate and win 5-1. Woden dropped out of the top 4.

Belconnen next and despite pressing the attack, Woden Valley could not put the ball away until well into the second half when Shaun Hagen finished neatly to make it 1-1. A crucial game vs Queanbeyan loomed but despite totally bossing the game only one goal came from Alex Barnes, this was the one that got away. However O'Connor were then beaten with an early penalty put away by Ben Rundle and Shaun Hagen adding to. The final result 2-0 was marred by the prospect of being without Andrew Kiley for the last game though. The penultimate game of the season saw a comfortable 3-nil victory over Olympic but on the same weekend Tuggeranong confirmed their finals spot and locked Woden into 5th.

It is always difficult to finish a season relying on the favourable results of other teams and seldom brings football happiness. .

If the Pathways concept is to work, every opportunity must be given to emerging players to be noticed in the Premier League. Woden PPL was run on that basis. While the PPL season did not take us to a position in the final four, two important outcomes are evident; the first is the undeniable quality of the PL18 players who either claimed a permanent place in the PPL or played off the bench for the PPL.. The second is the promise this season holds for a wonderful season in 2009.
